Crime Prevention

Safety is the first line of defense against criminal activity. The Fisk University Campus Safety Department investigates many incidents of crime where the victim did not exercise safe precautions. Here are a few tips of how to be safe on campus:

- Do not allow strange individuals to enter your LLC's.
- Lock the door to your room.
- Do not leave personal belongings unattended.
- Do not give anyone access to your bank cards, student I.D., wallet, and/or pin numbers.
- Do not share personal information (i.e. SSN#, Pin#, birthdate, home mailing address, etc.).
- Report suspicious activity.
- Immediately report acts of crime
- Record the description and serial numbers of all devices (TV, cell phone, computers, cameras, etc.)
