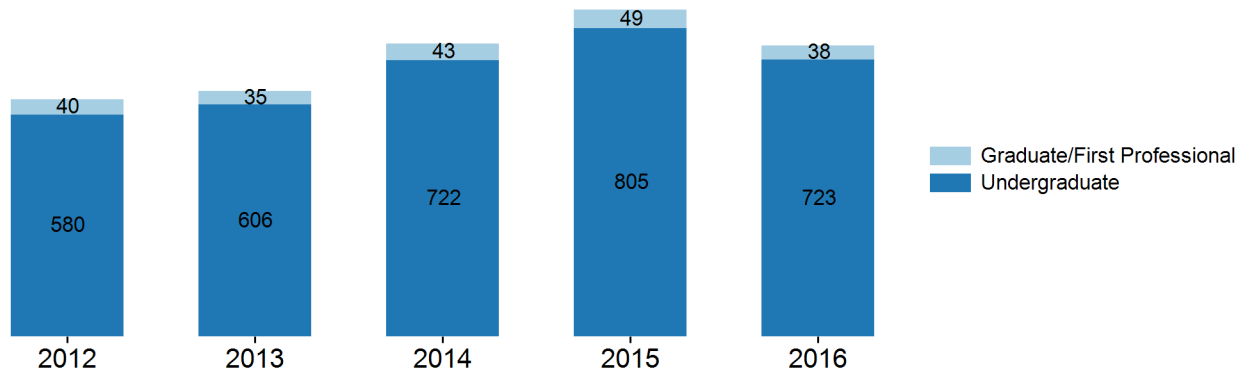

#### Fall Headcount Enrollment - Five-Year Trend



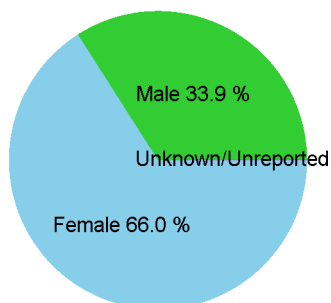

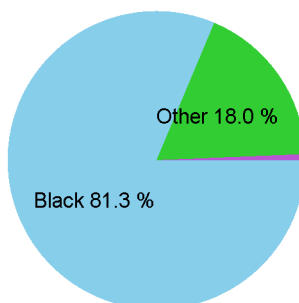

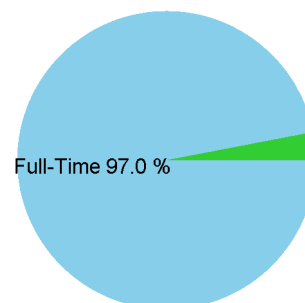
By Gender



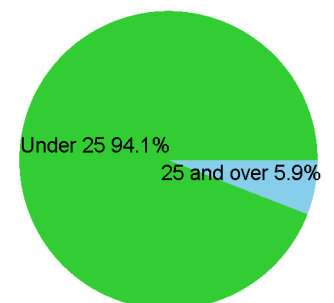
By Race



By Attendance Status



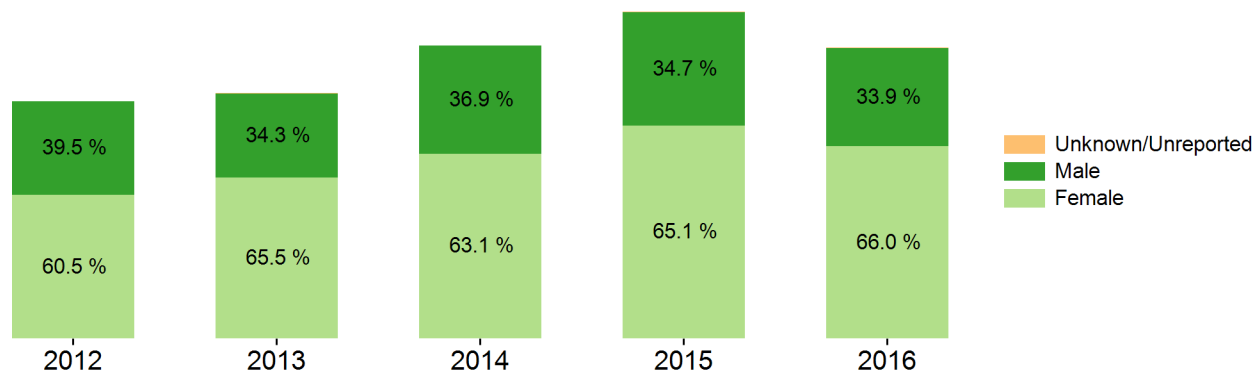

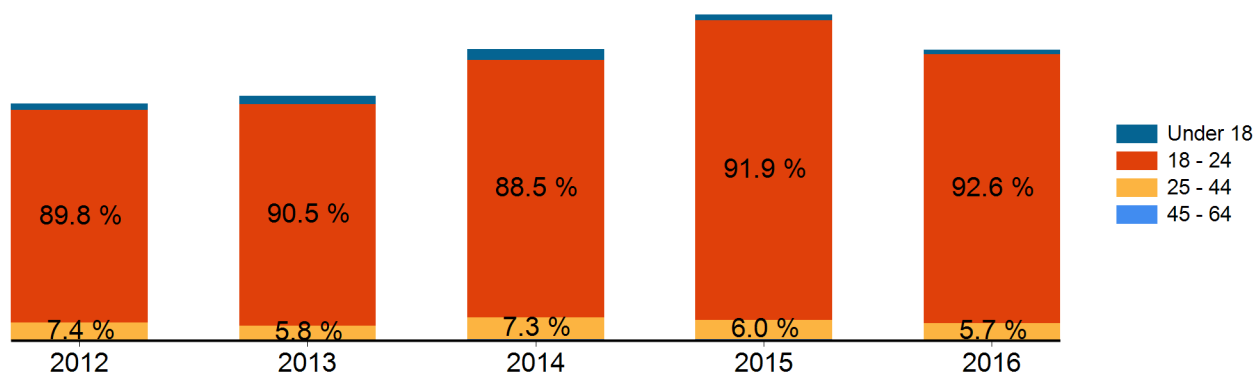

Fall Headcount by Gender - Five-Year Trend



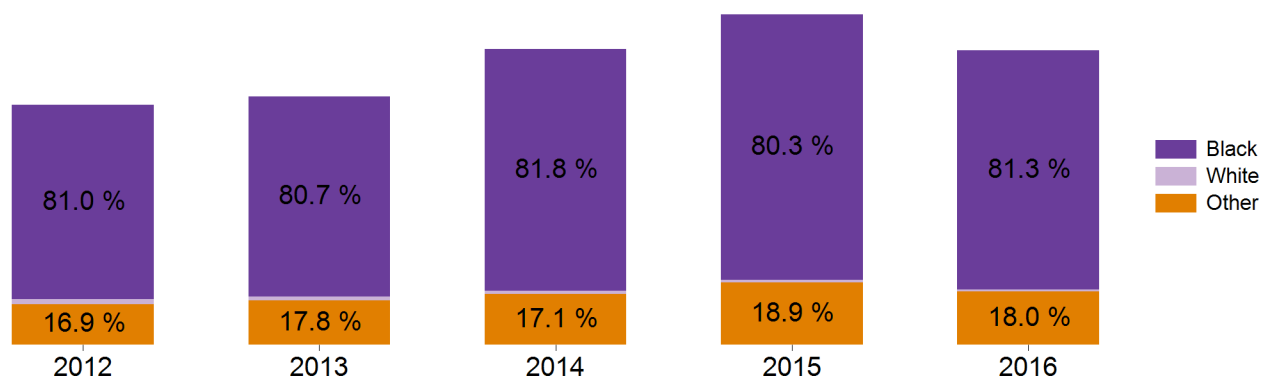

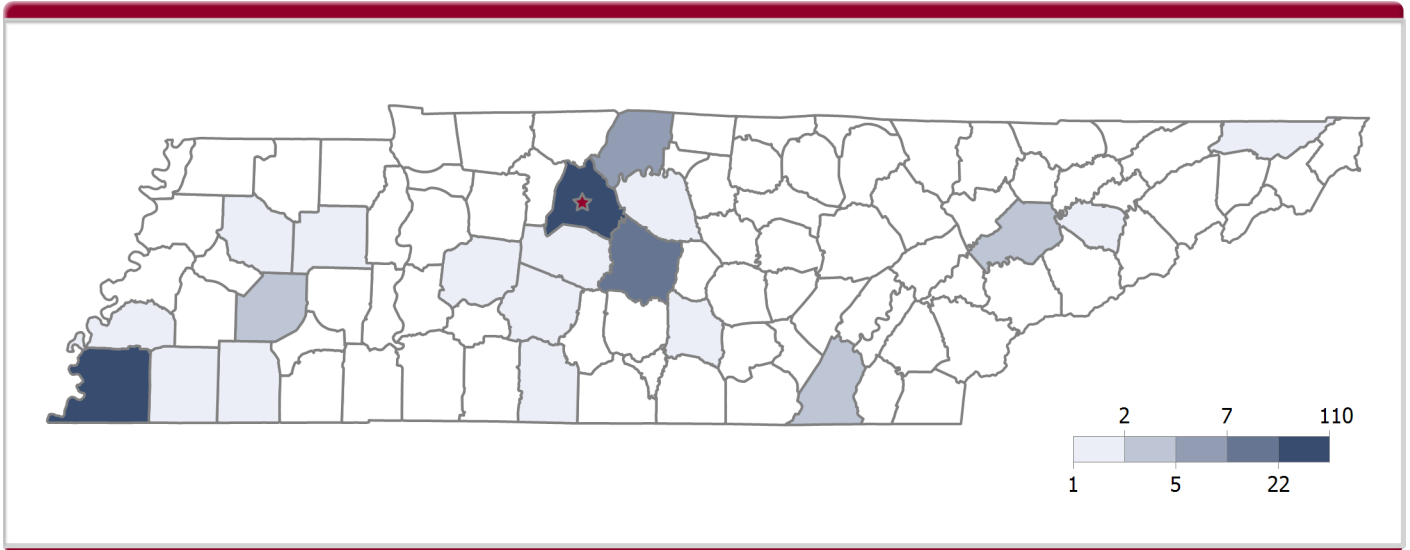

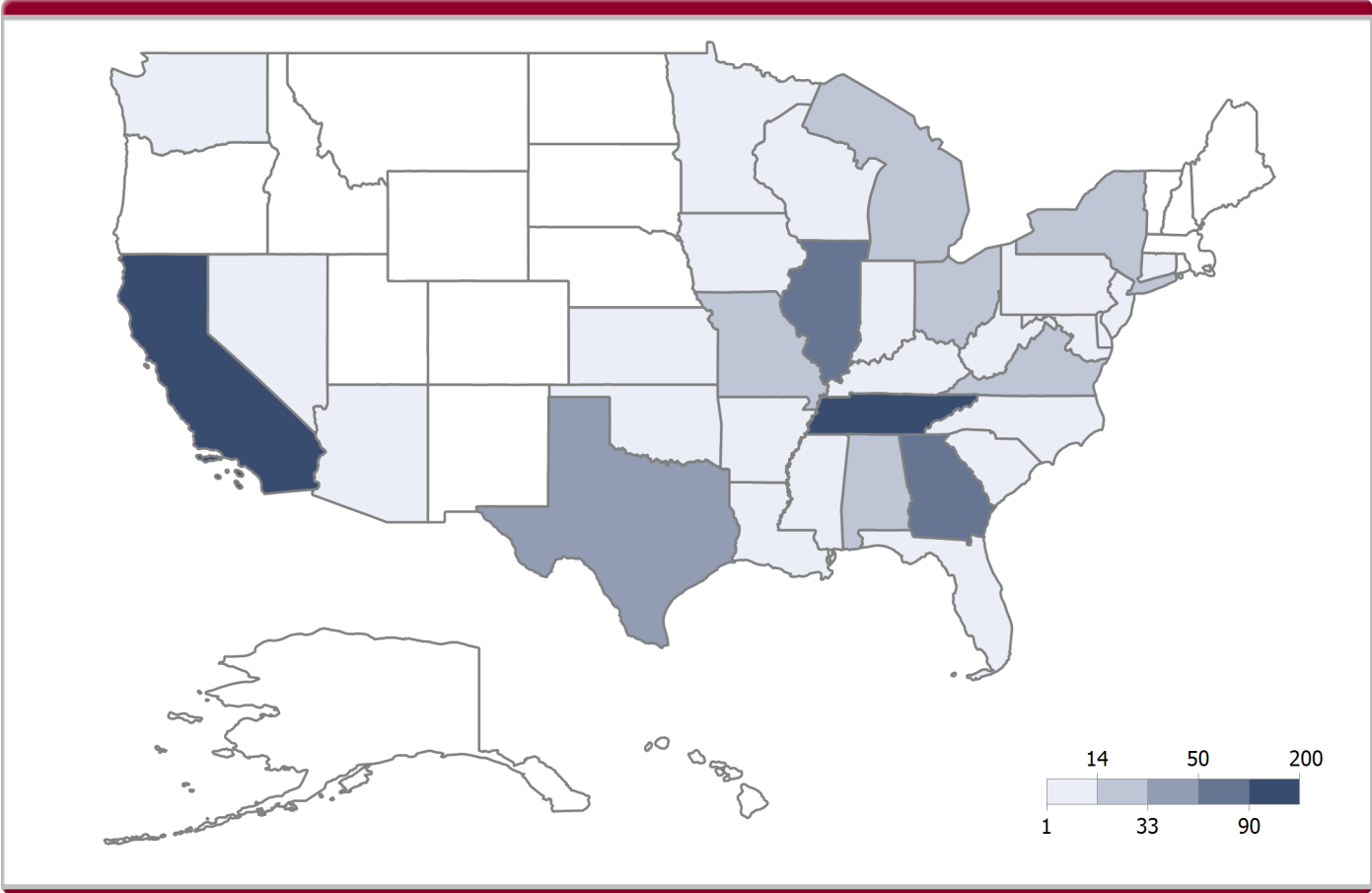
