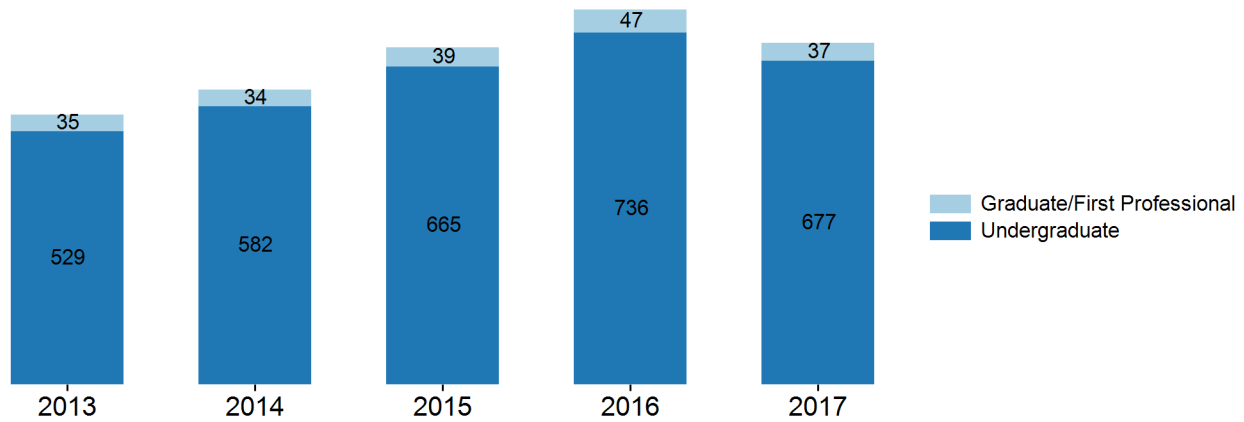

#### Spring Headcount Enrollment - Five-Year Trend



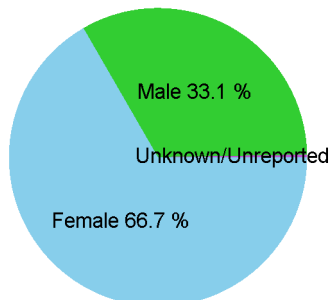

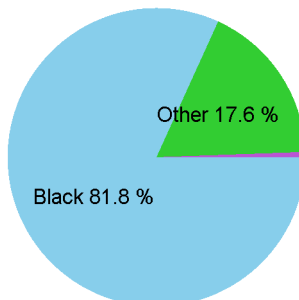

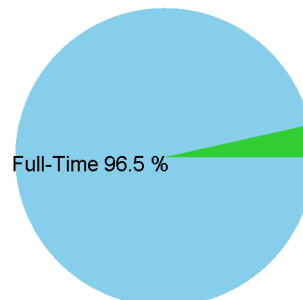
By Gender



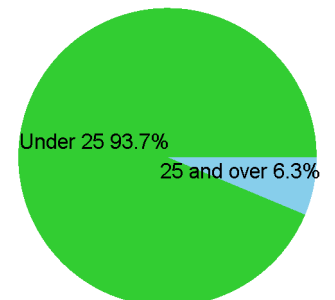
By Race

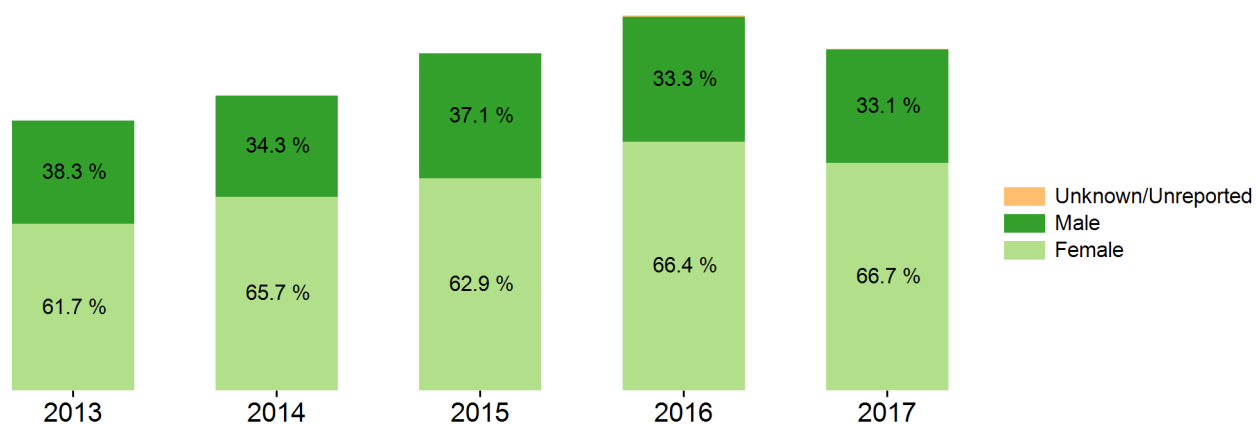

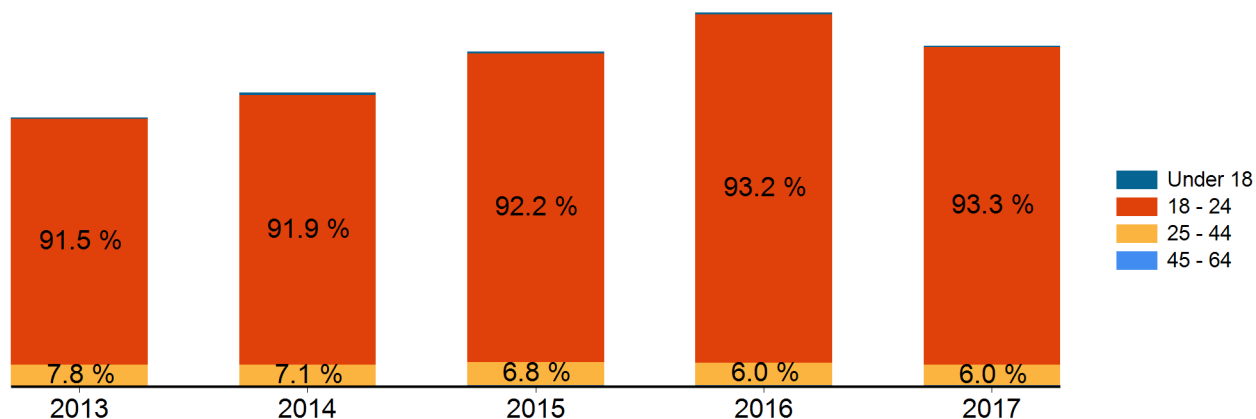

**Spring Headcount by Gender - Five-Year Trend**



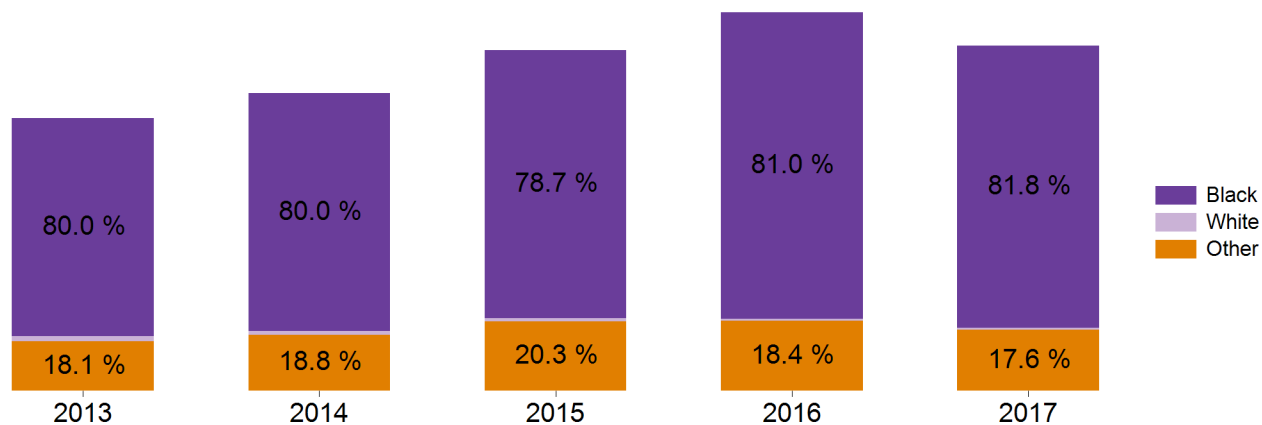

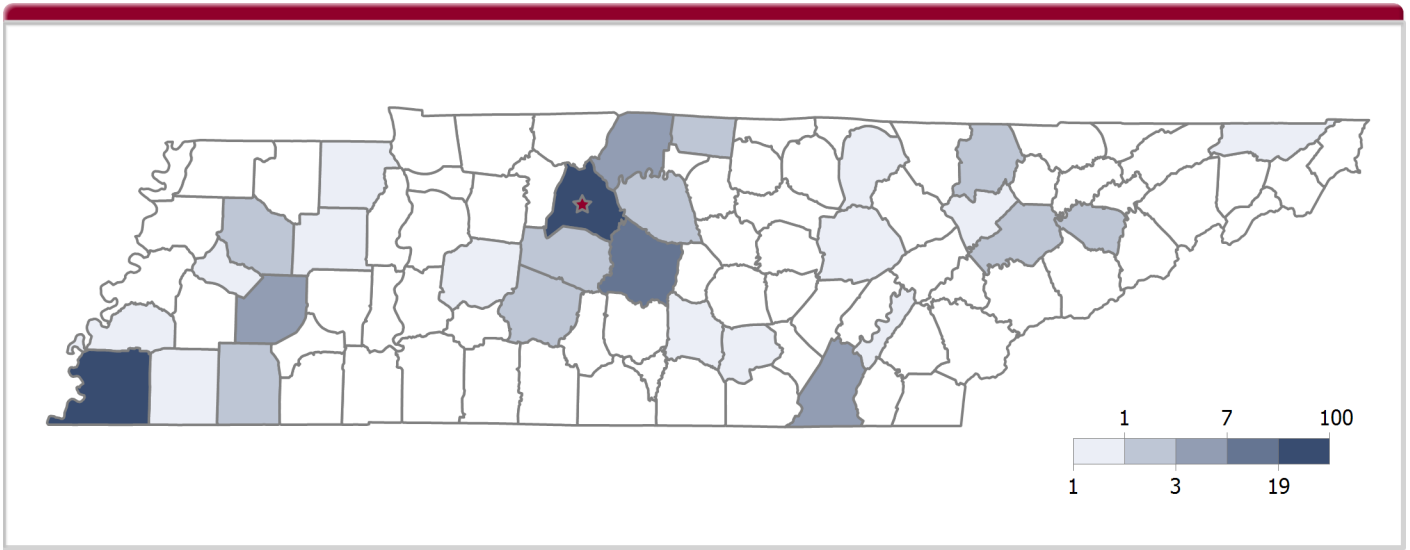

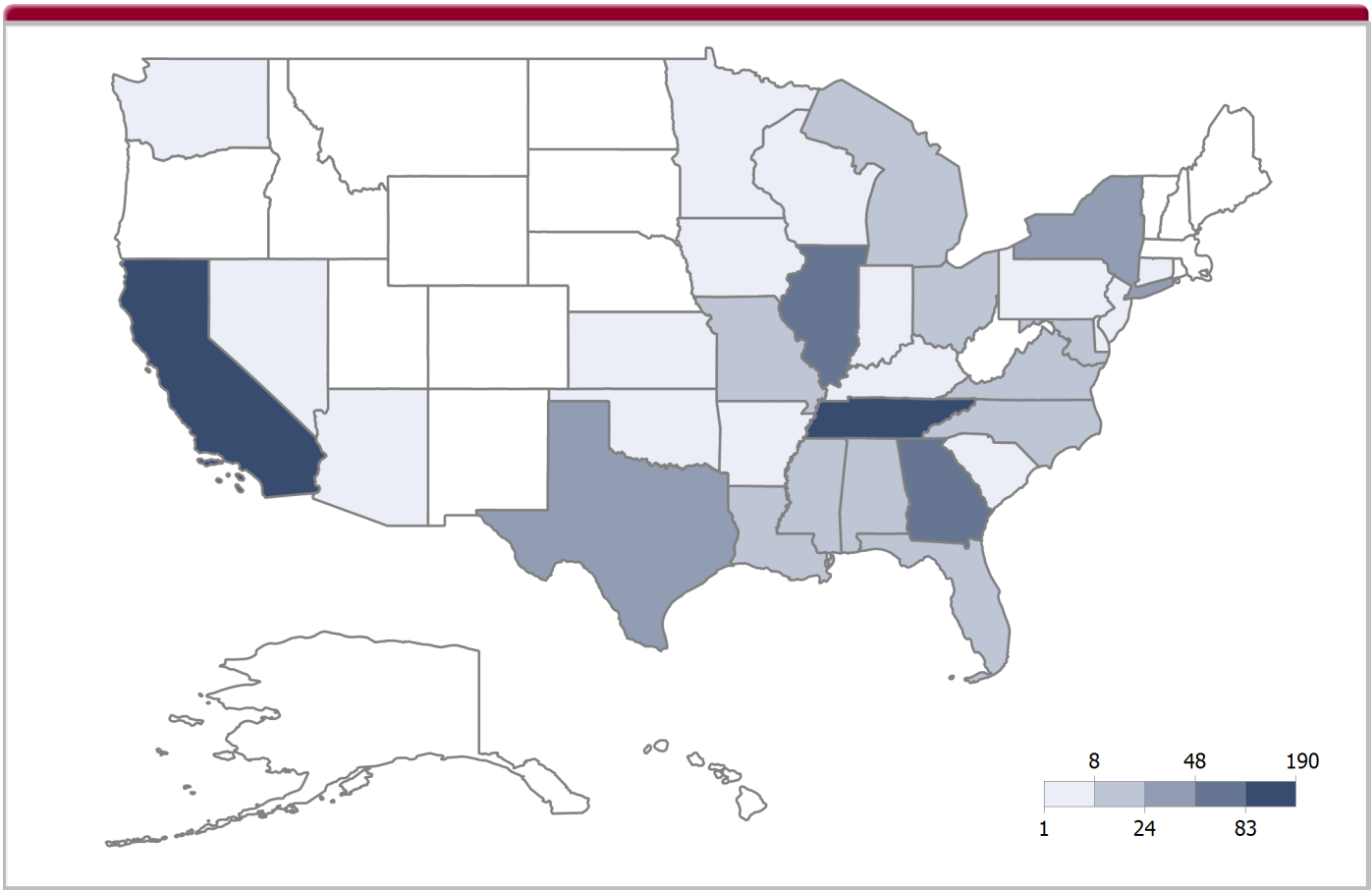
