BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Charles Spurgeon Johnson (1893-1956) was a preeminent sociologist, author, educator, and college president. He was known as the leader in making Fisk University the major Negro center for social research in the South and one of the outstanding research institutions in the entire field of race relations.

Born July 24, 1893 in Bristol, Virginia, Johnson attended Wayland Academy and college at Virginia Union University. While a student at Virginia Union University, Johnson served on the college debating team, was editor-in-chief of the college journal, president of student council, manager of the football and baseball team, member of the college quartet, a tennis player, and he finished his A.B. degree in 1916 after only three years. Johnson worked his way through graduate school at the University of Chicago's renowned School of Sociology. While in school, he was Associate Executive Secretary for the Illinois Governor's Commission on Race Relations in Chicago. Johnson took time away from school during World War I and was regimental sergeant major, infantry, A.E.F., U.S. Influenced at the Chicago School by Robert E. Park, an accomplished sociologist, Johnson obtained his Ph.D. and would continue to explore race relations throughout his lifetime.

In 1920, Johnson married Marie Antoinette Burgette (1891-1965) of Milwaukee. They moved to New York City where he became the National Urban League's Director of Research and Investigations after having previously served in the same capacity for the Chicago affiliate. His first book, *The Negro in Chicago: A Study of Race Relations and a Race Riot*, was published in 1922. He also founded and became editor of *Opportunity: A Journal of Negro Life*, the official organ of the National Urban League.

From 1928-1947, Johnson served as a professor of sociology, founder of the Social Center, the Director of the Department of Social Science, and the Social Science Institute Director (later the Race Relations Institute) at Fisk University. He was also a member of many committees and boards, namely the following: National Committee on Children and Youth; President Hoover's Conference on Home Building and Home Ownership (secretary); Sociology Committee of the Tennessee Valley Authority; President's Committee on Farm Tenancy; editor of board, *American Sociological Review*; Findings Committee, Conference on Inter-American Relations in Field of Education; executive and planning committee, White House Conference on Children in a Democracy; chairman, executive committee, Southern Committee on the Study of Lynching of the Southern Sociological Society; trustee, Julius Rosenwald Fund; trustee, Bethune-Cookman, LeMoyne, and Tillotson Colleges; secretary-treasurer, Sociology Research Association; first vice-president and president, Southern Sociological Society; U.S. Advisory Commission on Japanese Education (a.k.a. U.S. Education Mission).

Johnson was also director of many boards and projects. From 1942-48, he served as Co-director of the Race Relations Program of the Julius Rosenwald Fund. Simultaneously, he served as Director of the Race Relations Program of the American Missionary

Association from 1943-48 and Director of the Southern Regional Division, Negro Youth Study of the American Council on Education in 1946. His book on the historical-sociological conditions in Liberia, Africa, *Bitter Canaan*, was also published in 1946.

On October 29, 1946, Charles S. Johnson was elected president of Fisk University by the Board of Trustees. He succeeded Thomas Elsa Jones and became the first Black to serve in this capacity. He was officially inaugurated in November 1947.

During his presidency, Johnson remained active with other organizations. He served as a delegate for the United States to UNESCO, as a delegate for the World Council of Churches, and as a board member of the Bethlehem Center of Nashville. Johnson was the chairman of the executive committee of the Southern Regional Council and the director-at-large of the Board of Home Missions of the Congregational Christian Churches. In 1950, Johnson served on the President's Board for Foreign Scholarships under the Fulbright Act and as a member of the Tennessee Committee Midcentury White House Conference on Children and Youth. He also became the co-editor for *Race and Culture*. From 1951-56, Johnson was the vice-chairman of the American Committee for Cultural Freedom, and a consultant and Board of Trustees member to the John Hay Whitney Foundation. Johnson published his book, *Education and the Cultural Crisis* in 1951.

Johnson was an active member of the board of directors of the Association on American Indian Affairs, Inc. and a member of the board of governors of the American Association for the United Nations. In 1954, Johnson became a delegate to the Conference on Student Life and Education in the United States at the University of Chicago, and a member of the executive committee of the General Council of the Congregational Christian Churches. For six weeks in 1955, Johnson was a lecturer for the American-Scandinavian Foundation at the Universities of Stockholm, Oslo, and Copenhagen. Also in 1955, Johnson became the first African American to serve as a member of the board of trustees of the American Cancer Society. Johnson received honorary doctorate degrees from Columbia University, Harvard College, and Glasgow University in Scotland.

On October 28, 1956, Johnson died of heart failure in Louisville, Kentucky en route to New York for a Fisk University board meeting.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Charles S. Johnson Collection (1-27) contains twenty-seven boxes of material, and consists of four series: **Social Science Department Materials; Presidential Administration Records; Miscellaneous Materials; and Oversized Materials.** Similar to the other Charles S. Johnson Collections at Fisk University, this collection spans the years 1935-1956, and documents Johnson's career at Fisk University before and during his presidency. This collection adds significantly to the other collections cataloging the experiences and correspondence of Charles S. Johnson, and fills gaps in important information regarding his tenure at Fisk University.

Series I: Social Science Department Materials

The **Social Science Department Materials** series consists of fourteen subseries: **Social Center; General Education Board; Writings by Charles S. Johnson; Writings by other authors; Writings by unidentified authors; Writings of chapters in unidentified book; Reports; Notes; Studies; Surveys; Committees; Publications; Race Relations; and Miscellaneous.**

The **Social Center** materials consist of four sub-subseries: **General Information; People's College; Children's Institute; and Family Case Records.** The opening of the Fisk University Social Center on October 18, 1937 marked a significant period in Fisk's history in which Social Science students gained extensive field work serving Blacks with educational and recreational activities, and health and social service programs. The People's College and Children's Institute records document personal and professional attributes of Black families in area surrounding Fisk. The bulk of these records are from 1938, and they will be useful to a researcher interested in the demographics of working-class Black people in late 1930s and early 1940s Nashville. These records compliment the Charles S. Johnson Social Center Collection.

The **General Education Board (GEB)** subseries primarily contains reports and studies from the Board's efforts to study the education of Blacks in the Southern United States. The GEB was funded by John D. Rockefeller to aid education through scholarships, endowments, and grants to educational institutions regardless of race, sex, or creed.

There are four different subseries containing various writings produced out of, or related to the Social Science Department of Fisk University. They are divided among **Writings by Charles S. Johnson** as indicated on the articles, essays, and speeches. **Writings by other authors** are organized alphabetically by last name of the author. The **Writings by unidentified authors**, similar to the writings by Charles S. Johnson, are arranged alphabetically by subject. It is believed that some of these writings were works of Johnson's, but without proof of authorship they have been separated from those in which the author is clearly specified. Lastly, the **Writings of chapters in an unidentified book** are not integrated with the other writings because of original order. In order to keep the most original pattern of organization, these writings are separate because they were originally filed together, and with roman numerals. These roman

numerals are believed to signify chapters; however, the book to which these chapters may belong was not located.

The **Reports, Notes, Studies, and Surveys** subseries are all arranged alphabetically by subject. The various topics for which there is information help contemporary researchers understand the predominant issues of Johnson's time, and those most pressing for social science researchers. Reports of committees on which Johnson served are found in the reports subseries. The notes subseries provides some background insight into the bibliographical research conducted by Johnson and other staff of the Social Science Department, and may be useful to a researcher interested in the sources of information used during the 1930s and 1940s for specific topics. Population, tenancy, and tobacco studies are most prevalent in the studies subseries. Some of Johnson's statistical information and background research for major projects are found in this subseries. The surveys subseries is small, but different from the other types of documents found in this series.

There is much information on the American Youth Commission and the League of Nations International Commission of Inquiry Into the Existence of Slavery and Forced Labor in Liberia in the **Committees** subseries. Johnson's *Bitter Canaan* was produced from the latter commission. The subseries is arranged alphabetically by name of committee. The **Publications** subseries is arranged chronologically by publications related to the mission of the Social Science Department. The majority of these publications were not published from the department.

The **Race Relations** subseries is quite small, but serves as an addition to Race Relations Institute records found in the other Charles S. Johnson collections. The **Miscellaneous** subseries has book reviews Johnson wrote and of Johnson's works, as well as Social Science Department course information.

Series II: Presidential Administration Records

The **Presidential Administration Records** cover the years 1946-57. There are seven subseries within this series: **Inauguration; Board of Trustees; Admissions; Reports and Studies; Faculty Records; Faculty/Staff Correspondence; and Financial Records.**

The **Inauguration** subseries mostly contains invitation lists for alumni, other schools, and affiliated organizations. There is minimal correspondence, but if a researcher is interested in who was invited to the inauguration of the first African American president of Fisk University, this information will be useful.

Correspondence regarding meetings, committees, and with the treasurer of the Board, Charles Haydock, are all found in the **Board of Trustees** subseries. Additionally, reports from the President and consultants to the Board are included in these records. This subseries is arranged chronologically. The **Admissions** subseries is also chronological, and includes requirements, reservations, and general inquiries for admissions to the university. The **Reports and Studies** subseries is also arranged chronologically.

The **Faculty Records** consist mainly of bound meeting minutes of the Executive Committee of the Faculty and faculty meetings arranged chronologically. The **Faculty/Staff Correspondence** is arranged alphabetically by last name of the faculty or staff member. The correspondence ranges from 1951-1952.

The last subseries in the Presidential Administration Records are the **Financial Records**. The financial records are divided into four sub-subseries: **Reports; Correspondence; Grants; and Scholarships**. Within the various sub-subseries the documents are arranged chronologically. The reports, grants, and scholarships may be particularly useful to a researcher interested in the financial status of the university under Johnson's administration and organizations which supported Fisk.

Series III: Miscellaneous Materials

The **Miscellaneous Materials** of this collection do not fall under any of the previous series. They are divided into four subseries: **Fisk University Materials; Non-Fisk University Related Materials; Art Programs; and Publications with Mention of Fisk University**.

Fisk University Materials consist of general information on the university, correspondence, and commemorative event programs. There are copies of newspaper clippings about Fisk University. The records are arranged chronologically. Conversely, the **Non-Fisk University Related Materials** include publications and a *Crisis* magazine from 1931 which are unrelated to Fisk University. Also in this subseries are newspaper clippings regarding segregation, Blacks in sports, and Nashville.

The **Art Programs** are believed to have been collected by Johnson's wife, Marie Burgette Johnson, and are arranged alphabetically by title. They include programs of plays, musicals, and museum exhibitions. Notable among them is a program for the musical play, *St. Louis Woman*, adapted from the book *God Sends Sunday*, written by Arna Bontemps and Countee Cullen, and a "Tribute to [John] Keats" by Countee Cullen.

The final subseries contains **Publications with Mention of Fisk University**. These publications are primarily foundation or grant agency annual reports. Fisk University often benefited from the philanthropy of these organizations. The publications are arranged alphabetically by name of the publishing organization or institution.

Series IV: Oversized Materials

The final series of **Oversized Materials** contains large documents, photographs, and audio and visual recordings (some fragile) which needed separation from the rest of the collection. They are not arranged by subseries because the materials often fall under the aforementioned categories. Some of the audio and visual recordings include Johnson's funeral service on October 31, 1951, and the Fisk University Choir in 1948. These recordings may not be accessible to the public due to their format. Also found in this series is a 1934-1936 run of *The Weekly Mirror*, a newspaper from Liberia of which the Fisk University Library used to receive. These, like other newspapers, are fragile. Lastly, population statistical tables used for Johnson's studies are found in this series. They are quite large and would not fit in legal document boxes. These tables document the research of Johnson's studies on the tobacco industry.
