## Biographical Note

- 1872, July 31 Born in Montrose, Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania. Parents were Gertrude (Avery) and Edwin McKenzie, a merchant. Grandparents were Benajah McKenzie and Charles Avery.
- Educated in public schools of Montrose, until his senior year of high school, which was completed at South Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, where his family moved.
- 1891-1895 Attended Lehigh University, Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, from which he received the B. S. degree. Member of Phi Beta Kappa.
- 1894 Summer Session at University of Pennsylvania. Studied with Franklin Giddings and Simon Patten.
- 1895-1897 Tutored families of Railroad officials of Lehigh Valley Railroad and Pennsylvania Railroad.
- 1897-1900 Taught French, German, English, History and Economics at Juniata College.
- 1900-1903 Taught Modern Languages and Mathematics at Blight School for Boys while studying sociology, economics, and history at University of Pennsylvania.
- 1903-1905 Taught at Wind River Indian Boarding School in Central Wyoming, the Shoshoni Indian Reservation, one hundred and sixty-five miles from a railroad.
- 1908 Ph. D. University of Pennsylvania. Published his dissertation, The American Indian in Relation to the White Population of the United States, Columbus, Ohio.
- 1905-1914 Professor of economics and sociology at Ohio State University. Active in Civic Organizations of Columbus, Ohio.

Biographical Note  
(continued)

- 1910 Instrumental in the organization of the Society of American Indians which held its first meetings in Columbus, Ohio. He worked with Roland B. Dixon on the Indian census.
- 1912-1915 Chairman of Universities and Social Welfare Section of the State Conference of Charities and Correction.
- 1914 Spent time in France studying and traveling with Professor Comte, a most distinguished Frenchman who took children from Paris into the country for the summers. He was in France when World War I broke out.
- 1915 April - Married Nettie Evalyn Tressel, daughter of a Lutheran minister, Rev. Emmanuel Greenwold, and Mary (Hawkins) Tressel of Washington, D. C. and Columbus, Ohio.
- 1915 Made a study of Indian education from Kansas to Arizona.
- 1915-1925 President of Fisk University. Raised standards until Fisk became the first Negro institution to receive recognition as a standard college. He also raised a million dollar endowment fund and Fisk was put on the Carnegie Pension Plan.
- 1916 Awarded honorary degree, Doctor of Laws, Lehigh University.
- 1925-1926 Spent a year in France.
- 1926-1927 Studied Indian problems with the Indian Staff of the Institute for Government Research. Spent time on various Indian Reservations and in Washington, D. C.
- 1927-1941 Taught Sociology at Juniata College, Huntingdon, Pennsylvania.

- 1927-1929      Dean of Men at Juniata College.
- 1928            Director of Extension Services. He started the Altoona Center which later became part of the Extension System of Pennsylvania State University.
- 1931            Director of the Community Center Work in Huntingdon, Pennsylvania.
- 1935            Helped get a Public Library for Huntingdon, Pennsylvania and was a member of Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Association for Adult Education.
- 1941            Retired from Juniata College.
- 1941-1957      Continued his work with numerous Civic Organizations.
- 1957, Sept. 1   Died in Huntingdon, Pennsylvania.
