HAROLD E. THOMAS (1905-1968)

Harold E. Thomas was born on July 11, 1905 in Theria, Louisiana. He moved to Nashville at an early age, attended the public schools, and continued on to receive both the A.B. and M.A. degrees from Fisk University.

In 1941, as a teacher at Pearl Elementary School, he initiated court action against the Board of Education to equalize salaries of black teachers to whites. Appearing in his behalf were prominent attorneys Z. Alexander Looby and Thurgood Marshall.

After winning the case, he resigned in 1943 to work fulltime with the labor Movement. He was also an agent for the Metal Arts corporation.

Thomas was a member of Clark Memorial Church; lifetime member of the NAACP and Alpha Phi Alpha fraternity; the Nashville chapter of Frontiers International among other organizations. He died in 1968.
