COVID-19 Effective Practices

Fisk University continues to take proactive steps to protect the campus environment. It is the goal of the University during any outbreak to operate effectively and ensure that all essential services are continuously provided and that everyone is safe within the campus community.

In the fall of 2020, the university opened in a hybrid model. Freshman resided on campus for the first 7 weeks, while upperclassmen attended remotely. After the first 7 weeks the university took a week to clean and sanitize the campus before the upperclassman arrived for the second 7 weeks and freshman attended remotely. This hybrid plan was successful in limiting the number of positive COVID cases on campus to eight (8) for the entire 14-week semester.

Spring '21 the university continued with its hybrid model but allowed all student classes to return for a 16-week semester. Continuing with our proactive steps to protect the campus the number of positive student cases has been limited to five (5).






OFFICE OF STUDENT ACTIVITIES



Leadership Enrichment and Academic Development Program (LEAD) is a Student Support Services (SSS) initiative funded by the U.S. Department of Education, Office of Trio Programs.

WHAT DOES THIS PROGRAM DO?

The LEAD Program provides personal, career, and academic counseling, tutorial services, academic skills enrichment, workshops, and cultural activities to qualified students.

LEAD/SSS TARGET AUDIENCE

Targeted to first-generation, economically challenged, and/or differently-abled students, LEAD is funded to serve 200 students each year.





Students who are enrolled in the Program are provided services throughout their enrollment at Fisk University. The LEAD Program's professional staff, tutors and peer mentors enable students to:

- increase retention and graduation rates of participants

- receive additional assistance with difficult courses
- explore career and graduate school options
