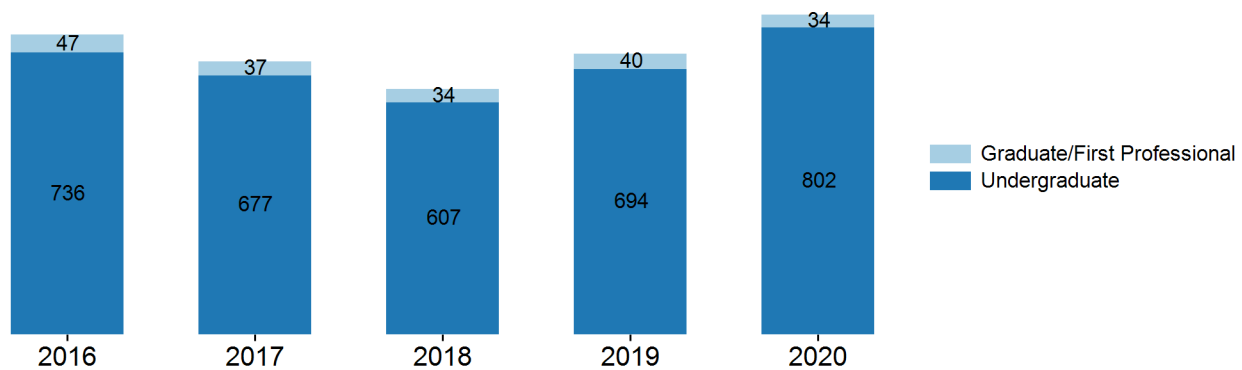

Spring Headcount Enrollment - Five-Year Trend



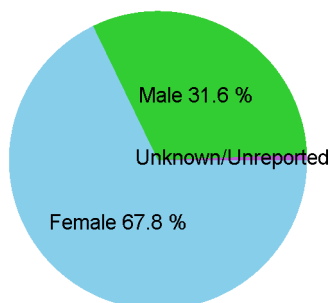

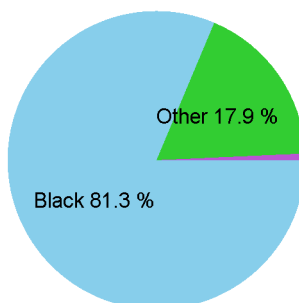

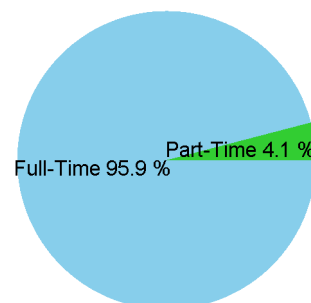
By Gender



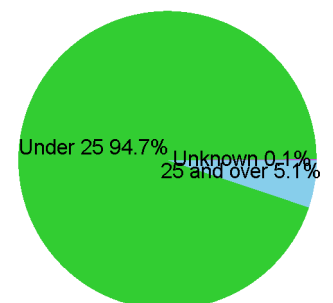
By Race



By Attendance Status



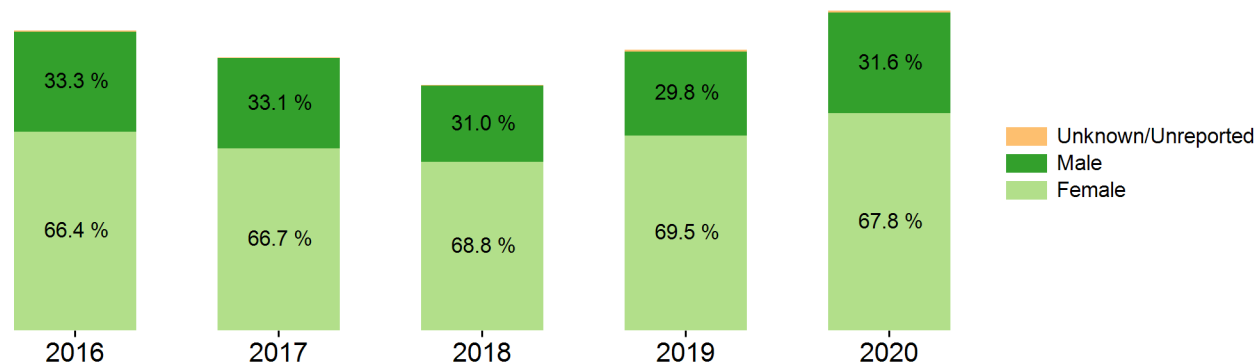

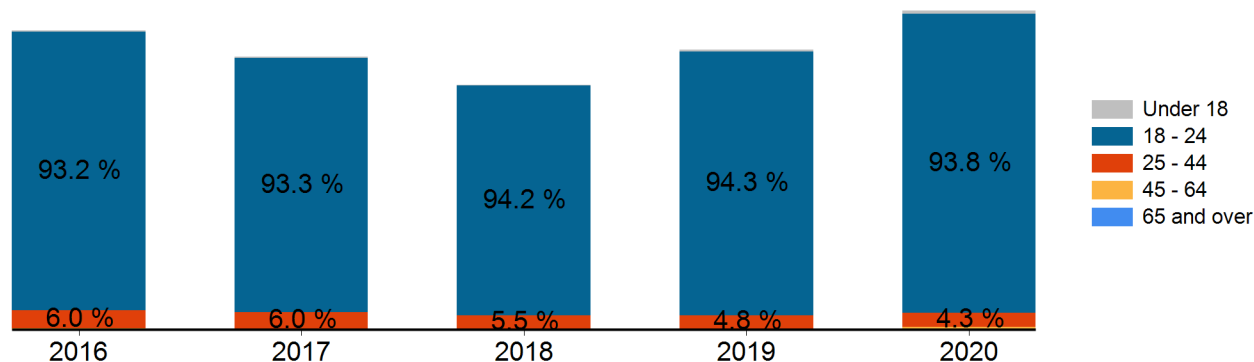

Spring Headcount by Gender - Five-Year Trend



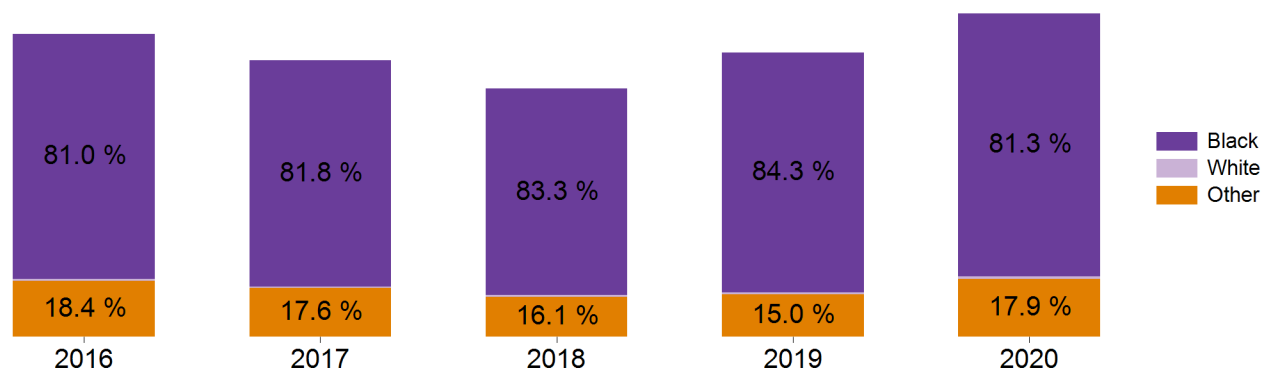

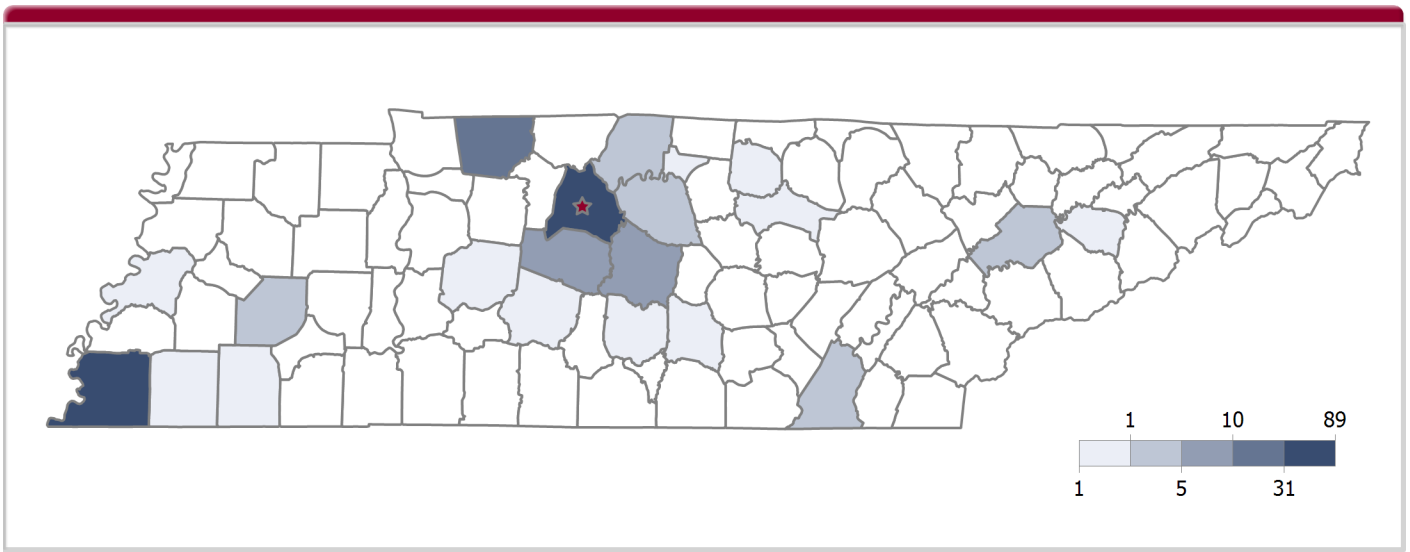

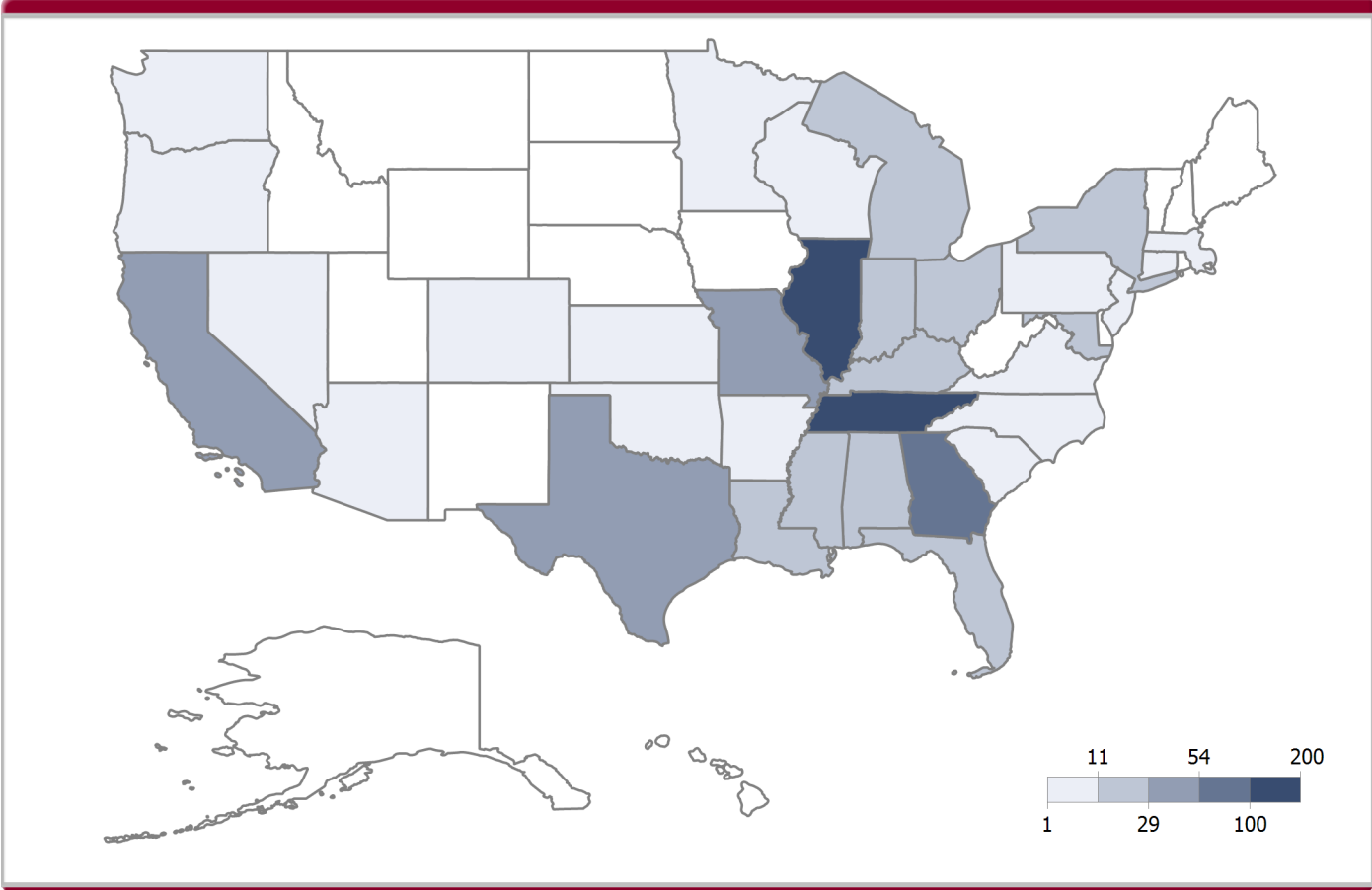
